About The RAC Teen Justice Fellowship

WHAT IS THE RAC TEEN JUSTICE FELLOWSHIP (RTJF)?

The RTJF is a learning intensive designed to train high schoolers to be organizers in their home communities. Fellows will meet virtually every week for six weeks to hone their leadership skills, learn how to organize and advocate, and get involved with the RAC's work. WHO SHOULD BE A JUSTICE FELLOW?

We are looking for talented, enthusiastic teens in grades 9-12 who are interested in learning more about how community organizing, advocacy, politics, and Judaism relate to each other. These teens are interested in gaining the skills to be changemakers. Teens who are ready to grow, learn, and take on a little bit of leadership make excellent fellows.

Teens from any denomination (or are unaffiliated) are welcome in the fellowship! We will learn through the lens of the Reform Movement's positions on <u>gun violence prevention</u> and <u>social justice</u> which are grounded in our <u>vision of a world overflowing with wholeness, justice, and compassion</u>.

WHAT WILL TEENS DO IN THE FELLOWSHIP?

In the RTJF, we will explore what teens are passionate about, learn how to build a strategy for making change and mobilizing our communities, and engage in advocacy with the RAC. The theme for Spring 2025 will be gun violence prevention, but the skills will be applicable to any cause that fellows are passionate about!

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT?

The RTJF will meet in the evenings in March and April for six one-hour sessions. There will be small tasks that fellows will be expected to complete between sessions, which are estimated to take 30-60 minutes, as well as a final organizing project on a timeline picked by each fellow.

WHEN DO APPLICATIONS FOR THE JUSTICE FELLOWSHIP CLOSE?

Applications for the fellowship are currently open and will close on Wednesday, March 5. We also encourage you to nominate any teens who you think would be a good fit. Both the nomination and interest forms can be found on RAC.org/Fellowship.

Ways to Promote

- Share directly with the teens you engage with via email or text.
- Plan to include information about the Fellowship in your upcoming newsletters.

- Spread the word to other youth-serving professionals in your network.

Helpful Reminders

- Reach out directly to teens who you think would be interested in or a good fit for the Justice Fellowship.
- Promote the fellowship on a variety of platforms, including social media, email, text, and in person.
- Encourage peer-to-peer engagement among the teens you engage with to help spread the word so they can participate with their friends.
- When posting on social media, make sure there's a way to access the application link,
 i.e. using a linktree in the bio of your Instagram profile.
- Consider those in your network who are teen-adjacent and share fellowship information with them as well (i.e. front desk staff, parents of teens, clergy, camp staff, etc.).
- You know your teens/community best! Our toolkit is intended to make promotion as easy
 as possible, but we trust your discretion with the language that feels most authentic and
 appropriate for your community.
