4. If your page does not list the members of your school board or the board members do not have email icons next to them, follow the link provided to your local school district's website.
  - a. Once on the site, look for a page or tab titled "School Board", "School Committee", or "Board of Education" and click on it. You may need to look for this page under the "About" tab of the website.
  - b. Once you've navigated to the page for your school board, you should then be able to find an email address for either the entire school board or the email addresses of each individual member.
5. If your page does list the members of your school board with email icons next to them, click the email icons below your school board member's name.
6. Write your email! If you are not familiar with your school district's policies, ask your school board what they are doing to protect LGBTQ+ and immigrant students. If you are more familiar, then use the RAC's talking points and model policies to ask your school board. to change or implement specific policies
7. Tell us about it! Fill out our feedback form and we'll send you a RAC sticker.
