

## **RAC-CA 2018 Bills Summary**

September 3, 2018

This chart shows the status of the bills RAC-CA has supported in 2018 – after the legislative session has ended, but before Governor Brown has signed or vetoed most of the bills. Only one bill below has been signed or vetoed by the Governor as of this writing: SB-10 Money Bail Reform.

AB 2499 Medical Loss Ratios (Arambula)	Requires health insurance companies to spend a higher
	percentage of premium dollars on health care.
SB 1100 Age Restrictions on Gun	expands to rifles and shotguns California's existing
Purchases (Portantino)	prohibition on purchase of handguns by anyone
	under 21 years of age.
AB 2888 Gun Violence Restraining	allows co-workers and school personnel to petition
Orders (Ting)	courts for a temporary restraining order to prevent
	people who are an extreme risk of harm to self or
	others from owning or acquiring a gun.
AB 2162 Supportive Housing Streamlining	allows developers to build supportive housing "by right,"
(Chiu)	i.e. without having to get a zoning variance.
Did Not Pass	
SB 974 (Lara) and AB 2965 (Arambula) The	remove eligibility barriers for low-income undocumented
Health4All Acts	adults of age 65 and older (SB 974), and under age 26 (AB
	2965), to participate fully in Medi-Cal, the CA version of
	Medicaid. We knew going into this year that getting all
	CA immigrants health care coverage would likely be a
	multi-year campaign.
AB 2430 Medi-Cal Program for Aged and	corrects an unfair anomaly whereby the Medi-Cal income
Disabled Persons (Arambula)	limit for disabled people and people over 65 is <u>lower</u> than
	the income eligibility limit for all others.







SB 918 Homeless Youth Act (Weiner/Rubio)	establishes the Office of Homeless Youth, funded at \$60
	million from the General Fund
SB 1010 Parolees: Supportive Housing Pilot	creates a pilot project to provide supportive housing to
program (Beall)	parolees who are either experiencing homelessness or
	were homeless when incarcerated and have no place to
	go upon discharge.
It's Complicated	
SB-10 Money Bail Reform (Hertzberg)	Eliminates money bail and sets up preventative detention
	in its place. The bill passed the legislature and was signed
	into law by Governor Brown, but in a form RAC-CA
